American Indian Heritage Day activities planned

Great Promise, Bullock Museum partner to host live drumming, dancing and ceremony

SEPTEMBER 21, 2015 (**AUSTIN, TX**) - A variety of performances and educational opportunities will highlight the third annual Texas American Indian Heritage Day celebration on Friday, September 25, 2015, at the Bullock Texas State History Museum. Presented by the museum and Great Promise for American Indians, the event will feature public performances during the day at 10 and 11:30 a.m. and a public celebration from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.

Led by State Representative Roberto Alonzo Dist. 104 (D-Dallas), members of the Texas State Legislature passed H.B. No. 174 in 2013 to create a day to honor the history and heritage of American Indians in Texas and to recognize their many contributions to Texas culture. Held the last Friday in September, American Indian Heritage Day celebrates the historical, cultural and social contributions of American Indian communities to the state. This is observed through ceremonies, activities and programs in public schools and other places to celebrate traditional and contemporary American Indian culture.

Dancing, drumming, storytelling and educational presentations will occur throughout the day at the museum. School groups have been invited to daytime program and will participate in activities that illustrate Native American cultural traditions including storytelling, clothing decoration, art creation and food creation.

In the evening, the public is invited to enjoy the traditional and contemporary arts of Texas's American Indian groups. This free public program will honor American Indians of yesterday and today, with art displays, dancing and drumming performances. Stations to learn more about traditional art and food will be available.
