

Bullock Museum turning blue this summer

Active military families can visit free May 30 through Sept. 5, 2016

MAY 27, 2016 (AUSTIN, TX) — The Bullock Texas State History Museum is proud to announce the launch of Blue Star Museums, a collaboration among the National Endowment for the Arts, Blue Star Families, the Department of Defense and museums across America, to offer free admission to the nation's active duty military personnel including National Guard and Reserve and their families from Memorial Day through Labor Day 2016.

The Bullock Museum is one of more than 2,000 museums in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and American Samoa taking part in the initiative. A complete list of participating museums is available at arts.gov/bluestarmuseums.

"The Bullock Museum offers military discounts for all of its exhibitions and films in an effort to provide educational and entertainment opportunities all year long," Director Dr. Victoria Ramirez said. "We are excited to expand this offer to include free exhibition admission all summer to active military members and their families. It makes the Bullock Museum a great summer travel destination."

Our Global Kitchen: Food, Nature, Culture is a 7,000-sqare-foot special exhibition on view through July 24 that features rare artifacts, video experiences and interactives exploring the

intersection of food, nature, history and human culture. A full slate of programs and a tasting kitchen powered by Whole Foods Market offers opportunities for visitors to taste seasonal treats.

They also can experience the sights and sounds of an Aztec marketplace, cook virtual dishes from around the world, and discover the elements of the last meal eaten by a 5,000-year-old mummified human.



The Bullock Texas State History Museum in Austin will offer free admission for active military and their families from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Military discounts are available for IMAX and special-effects movies.

Another special exhibition, *Journey Into Big Bend*, is on view all summer and features a 75-million-year-old giant crocodile skull and other fossils, large-scale images of Big Bend National Park and more.

Both exhibitions and the Texas History Galleries are included in the free admission offer through Blue Star Museums, which has become a nationally recognized program that helps bring local military and civilian communities together and offers families fun and enriching activities where they live. Leadership support is provided by MetLife Foundation through Blue Star Families for the program which provides families an opportunity to enjoy the nation's cultural heritage.

The free admission program is available to any bearer of a Geneva Convention common access card (CAC), a DD Form 1173 ID card (dependent ID), or a DD Form 1173-1 ID card, which includes active duty U.S. military - Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, as well as members of the National Guard and Reserve, U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps, NOAA Commissioned Corps - and up to five family members.

The Bullock Museum also offers military discounts on documentaries and Hollywood feature films that show daily in the museum's IMAX[®] Theatre. Located in downtown Austin, the museum features on-site parking, a café and museum store.
