## Spooktacular slated for Oct. 28 at the Bullock

## Games, treats, science activities planned at Halloween event

This year's program invites skeletons of all shapes and sizes to create glow in the dark art with Smudge Studios, experiment with bony science, and move their bones to the spooky beats. Come engineer the bones of a building, explore bones and joints to make a simple prosthetic hand, enjoy free screenings of *Toy Story of Terror*, and have fun with always popular Boo Bubbles!

"Spooktacular is a terrific opportunity for families with kids of all ages to enjoy time together at the Museum," Bullock Museum Head of Education Kate Betz said. "This year, kids will make art, experiment with science, and dance the night away all while learning about a classic Halloween favorite—skeletons."

The Austin nonprofit Girlstart will partner with the museum once again to bring the popular science series "Spooky Science Extravaganza" to Spooktacular. Families can enjoy hands-on

activities like creating dry ice boo bubbles, exploring the structural and chemical properties of spider webs, climbing into a portable planetarium, watching vampire blood demos, and more.

"Halloween is a great time to have extra science fun," Girlstart Executive Director Tamara Hudgins said. "Goo, slime, bubbles, bones, and dry ice are all part of our Halloween tradition here at Girlstart. Each year, we bring back our favorite spooky
