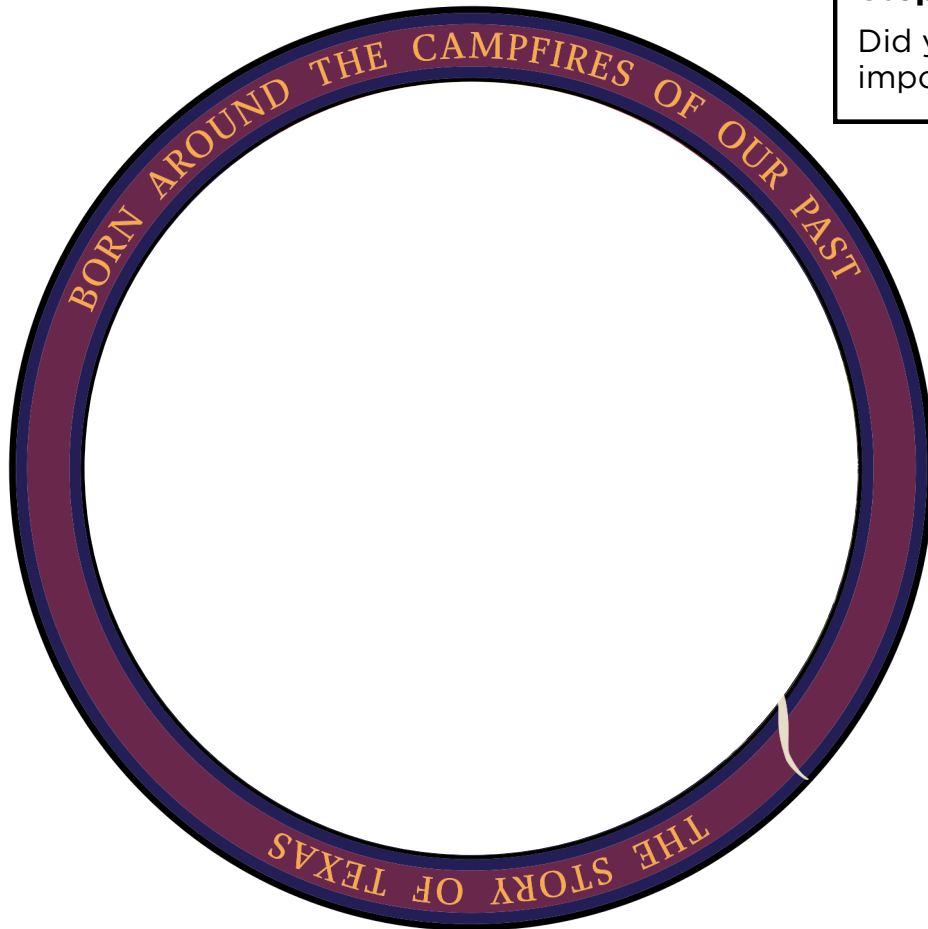
## Exploration

# Design Your Own Terrazzo

## Step 1: Explore the galleries

A historian learns how to closely study artifacts and other primary and secondary sources. Make your way through the galleries, and this time pay attention to people, objects, plants, animals, and activities you see on each floor.



## Step 2: What symbols are important to you?
