



WARM UP:

This world you have imagined yourself in was a reality for most humans throughout history, including the American Indians here in Texas.



Without stores and machines, you have to make everything from things found in nature.

nomad

farmer










Depending on where you live, nature can be very different!

Mountains and Basins Characteristics:

Climate: hot by day and cool by night in the desert, very dry (only 8-20 inches of rain a year)

Landscape: mountains, basins, valleys, desert

Plants: cactus, brush/short grass, yucca, pine, oak, maple trees

Animals: bison, coyote, elk, prairie dog

How do these characteristics influence the way American Indians lived in this region?

Great Plains Characteristics:

Climate: mostly dry (15-28 inches of rain per year) northern areas colder in the winter, southern areas get more rain, dust storms

Landscape: canyons in NW, flat grasslands in SE, limestone and granite, caves, aquifers

Plants: cactus, mesquite, cedar, cottonwood trees

Animals: bison, owl, prairie dog, badger, deer, antelope

North Central Plains Characteristics:

Climate: wide ranging temperatures (hot summers, cooler winters) 20-30 inches of rain per year, risk of tornadoes

Landscape: rolling plains, short grasses and brushy plants

Plants: oak, mesquite, pecan, walnut trees

Animals: bison, hawk, beaver, quail, deer, armadillo

Coastal Plains Characteristics:

Climate: Semi-tropical, warm and humid, rarely freezes, 30-60 inches of rain per year Landscape: flat, low, prairie grasslands, sand beaches, marshes, bays, barrier islands Plants: Pine forests, oak, mesquite, willow and hickory trees

Animals: Fish, shellfish, fox, deer, bison, otter, alligator
