

Bullock Museum to offer free admission for military families all summer

The Museum will take part in the tenth year of the Blue Star Museums program

MAY 9, 2019 (AUSTIN, TX) — The Bullock Texas State History Museum is proud to join museums nationwide in participating in the tenth year of Blue Star Museums, a program that provides free admission to the nation's active duty military personnel and their families during the summer. This year's program will begin on Armed Forces Day, May 18, and conclude on Labor Day, September 2.

"One of the things we love most about our summer months is being able to give back to the men and women of our military and their families by providing a wonderful place for them to explore Texas history," said Bullock Museum Director Margaret Koch. "It is an honor to treat them to an intergenerational experience that helps shape long-lasting memories and inspires learning."

Military families are invited to explore three floors of Texas history galleries and multiple special exhibitions. The Museum is currently hosting the traveling exhibition *WWI America* through August 11, marking its last stop nationwide. Visitors will also enjoy the aerial photography exhibition *Texas From Above: The Photographs of Jay B Sauceda* through June 16 and *Cowboys in Space & Fantastic Worlds*, a family-friendly history of science fiction westerns, opening on July 13. Many opportunities throughout the Museum invite visitors of all ages to take part in hands-on activities each week, such as the drop-in programs Make It Tuesdays and Sense-sational Thursdays, included with exhibition admission.

The Blue Star Museums program is an initiative of the National Endowment for the Arts in collaboration with Blue Star Families, the Department of Defense, and more than 2,000 museums nationwide. Free admission is available for those currently serving in the United States Military, including Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, members of the Reserves, National Guard, U.S. Public Heath Commissioned Corps, NOAA Commissioned Corps, and up to five family members.
