Bullock Museum to offer free exhibit admission for military families all summer

The Museum will participate in the Blue Star Museums program Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day

MAY 26, 2021 (AUSTIN, TX) — The Bullock Texas State History Museum is proud to join museums nationwide in participating in Blue Star Museums, a program that provides free admission to the nation's active-duty military personnel and their families during the summer. This year's Blue Star Museums program at the Bullock Museum is sponsored by Lisa and Clay Cooley. Free exhibition admission for military families will be available Saturday, May 29 through Sunday, September 5.

"We understand that military families need time and opportunities to explore and have fun in a relaxed atmosphere that encourages learning together. The Bullock Museum is the perfect place to experience Texas' past, and we are grateful for a chance to give back to those who are serving our nation," said Bullock Museum Director Margaret Koch.

Military families are invited to explore three floors of Texas History Galleries, including a newly renovated section exploring equal rights in Texas, and two special exhibitions. *GUITAR: The Instrument That Rocked the World*, on view through August 15, takes visitors on a fascinating journey through 5,000 years of the science, sound, history and pop culture of the iconic instrument. *Black Citizenship in the Age of Jim Crow*, on view June 19 through November 28, explores the struggle for full citizenship and racial equality that unfolded in the 50 years after the Civil War, centering on African Americans who persevered in the face of a developing legal system of Jim Crow laws and policies.

Free admission is available for those currently serving in the United States Military, including Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, members of the Reserves, National Guard, U.S. Public Health Commissioned Corps, NOAA Commissioned Corps, and up to five family members. Qualified members must show a Geneva Convention common access card (CAC), DD Form 1173 ID card (dependent ID), or a DD Form 1173-1 ID.
