Bullock Museum joins Museums for All program thanks to Union Pacific grant

SNAP and WIC benefits recipients can explore the Museum for free starting November 1

OCTOBER 25, 2022 (AUSTIN, TX) — The Bullock Texas State History Museum, with support from the Texas State History Museum Foundation, is the proud recipient of a Union Pacific Railroad Community Ties Giving Program grant. The grant enables the Museum to join more than 600 museums nationwide in providing free exhibition admission through the Museums for All Program to those receiving food assistance.

"We are so grateful to Union Pacific and the Texas State History Museum Foundation for its support in helping the Bullock become more accessible to everyone in our communities," said Bullock Museum Director Margaret Koch. "Museums for All allows those with limited financial resources to visit the Museum exhibitions with their families without economic barriers."

Starting November 1, families who participate in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) can gain free exhibition admission by presenting their EBT card onsite at the Bullock Museum's ticketing counter. Free admission is available for EBT cardholders and any accompanying family or guests. Admission provides access to all exhibition galleries, including the Museum's three floors of Texas History Galleries and two special exhibition spaces.

Union Pacific's Community Ties Giving Program provides small- and medium-sized grants that align with the railroad's priority cause areas in safety, workforce development and community spaces.
