Guests will be surrounded by a uniquely 'Texas' atmosphere including stunning aerial photographs of the Texas borderlands by local Austin photographer Jay B Saucedo.

Award-winning chefs tell the story of Texas through food, and a reinvented menu highlights savory Texas favorites. Menu items include baked potatoes with choice of toppings and roadhouse chili with plenty of spice. Locally sourced products combined with a pride for Texas heritage create a stand-out dining experience for all visitors.
